





- Eye olive brown
- Orbital ring yellow

- Oct-Apr, some resident on coast
- L 21 in
- WS 54 in (4 ft 6 in)
- Eye dark brown
- Orbital ring red

#### Heermann's Gull Larus heermanni

- L 19 in
- WS 51 in (4 ft 3 in)
- Jun-Feb (some resident)

- Eye brown to black
- Orbital ring red


- L 17 ½ in

- Oct-Apr
- Eye yellow
- Orbital ring red

- Orbital ring pink



- Nov-Mar
- Eye dark blue
- Orbital ring red




